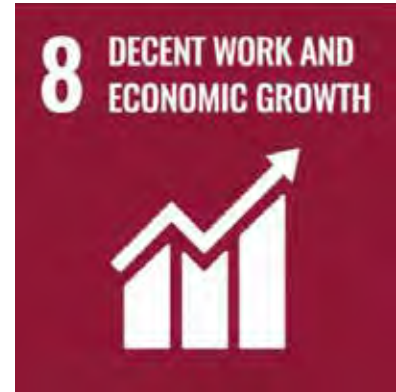

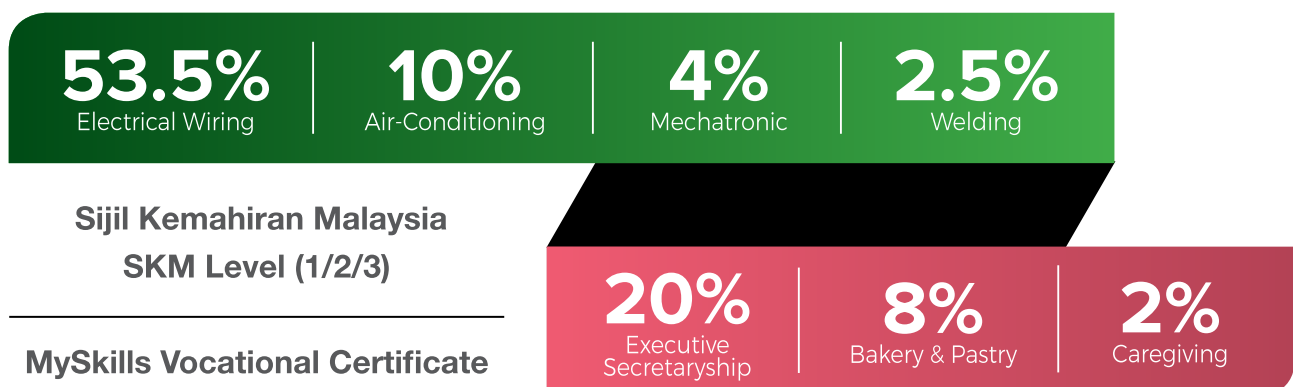

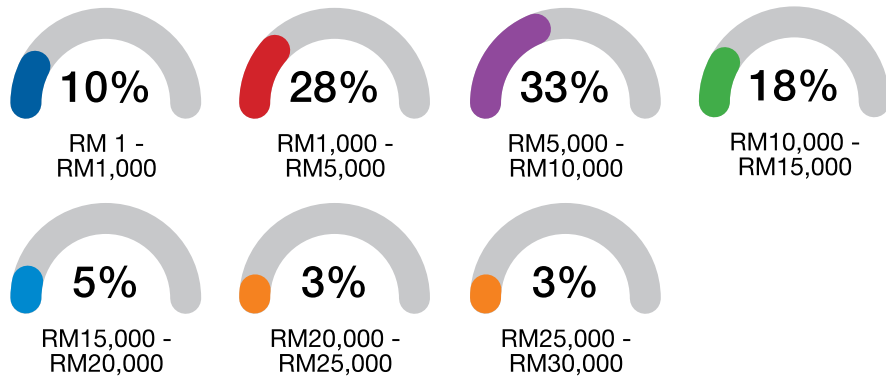

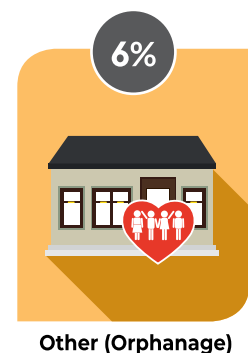

We are pleased to have improved our transparency score from 90% to 95%, reflecting our continued commitment to openness and accountability.

Tan Kah Kee Award

MySkills Foundation was honoured to receive the Tan Kah Kee award in 2018 from the Tan Kah Kee Foundation, in recognition for achieving outstanding community (youth) development milestones.

JAGAT Film

MySkills Foundation co-produced the film, JAGAT - known as the best Malaysian movie of 2016. The movie won several awards for accurately depicting the plight of Malaysian Indians during the post-estate era and their survival during harsh circumstances.



Accredited Charity (2015 - 2022)

From 2015 to 2022, MySkills Foundation was a tax-exempt organisation sanctioned by the Malaysian Ministry of Finance. Later, MySkills was also recognised as a US Public Charity equivalent, validated by several organisations including NGOSource, Global Giving, Blackbaud, Tech Soup and the Silicon Valley Community Foundation.

World Bank Report

MySkills Foundation served as a case study and became a recommended course of action to the Malaysian government in a study conducted by the World Bank, Economy Planning Unit (EPU) and Khazanah Nasional. Their report 'Achieving A System of Competitive Cities in Malaysia' highlighted the MySkills Foundation intervention model as worthy of scaling and replicated in other population areas with critical numbers of at-risk youth.

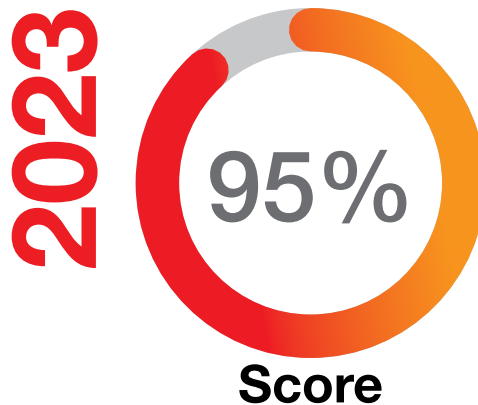
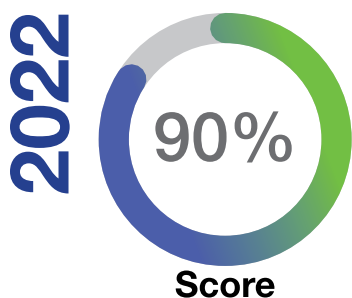

This report, now in its second edition, re-evaluated 1,710 foundations, including a reassessment of the 1,567 foundations initially analyzed in 2022. The 2023 report highlighted that among the 1,567 foundations re-evaluated, 115 experienced a change in their ratings - 83 foundations improved their scores, while 29 saw a decline. SAP Social Sabbatical 2024 - Strengthening MySkills Cause for Long-Term Sustainability



In July 2024, MySkills Foundation was privileged to participate in the SAP Social Sabbatical program, a global initiative facilitated by Pyxera Global that provides pro bono consulting to non-profits and social enterprises. Over the course of this transformative 30 days, three dedicated SAP consultants - Ms. Daniela Norato Auer, Ms. Neha Agrawal, and Mr. Piyush Kumar - worked dedicatedly with our team, delivering expert guidance that significantly enhanced our operational capacity and strategic planning efforts.

The consultants brought a wealth of knowledge and experience to MySkills, offering invaluable support across several critical areas. Their work included a comprehensive branding and competitor analysis that informed a strategic revision of our social enterprise, Primus Wellness. This revision aimed to improve its sustainability by identifying new strategies and optimising our existing revenue streams. The consultants' insights culminated in a practical manual titled Social Enterprise Transformation and Action Plan (For Primus Wellness). This essential resource outlines strategic steps to optimise our operations, enhance efficiencies, and scale our social impact, providing a clear roadmap for our future growth.

Demonstrating remarkable dedication, the SAP consultants immersed themselves in our mission, spending an entire week at ground zero to understand the challenges faced by our at-risk youth. Despite cultural differences, they were profoundly moved by the impact of MySkills' work and embraced the task of creating a business plan, despite limited experience in business development backgrounds. Their thorough research identified the Moringa industry as an \$18.2 billion market, profiling 38 Malaysian companies engaged in Moringa-based products. Their personal commitment to our cause was evident throughout their work, making a significant and lasting contribution to our future sustainability.

As we implement the recommendations from the SAP consultants, we are focused on creating a lasting, positive impact on the youth beneficiaries we serve. The consultants provided both long-term and short-term strategic plans that are guiding us as we make steady progress. We are immensely grateful for their efforts; they not only identified opportunities for ongoing volunteer support from SAP but also pledged their commitment to continue



assisting us. This ongoing collaboration ensures that our relationship with SAP will endure, paving the way for further initiatives that sustain and expand MySkills' mission.

This is not farewell to the SAP Social Sabbatical team as this is the beginning of our evolution. We reflect on how this one-month engagement has evolved into a deeply personal journey for all of us. We are eager to measure our

MySkills Foundation and Yayasan Hasanah have collaborated on two key programs aimed at uplifting B40/B20 families. The first initiative, the Holistic Transformation Skills Training, focuses on skills development and entrepreneurship, equipping graduates with the tools they need to secure employment and improve their socioeconomic standing. The second initiative, Empowering Students through After-School Engagement, provides holistic support to foster personal and academic growth in youth. Both programs exemplify Yayasan Hasanah's commitment to sustainable human capital development and long-term impact in underserved communities.



Since 2022, the Holistic Transformation Skills Training program has successfully prepared 100 at-risk youth for internships and job placements. Many graduates have already secured employment, while others are currently completing internships or awaiting full-time roles. The program has significantly enhanced job readiness, with employed graduates now earning at least RM1,500 per month, demonstrating a clear impact on their financial well-being. This success is rooted in the program's comprehensive support, which includes mentorship to help youth navigate challenges, retain employment, and develop savings for the future.



Beyond the Bells @ Kangkar Pulai

Launched in January 2024, the Beyond the Bells project is a two-year initiative aimed at supporting 150 secondary school students, particularly those from vernacular primary schools, by providing effective after-school engagement to combat learning losses and high dropout rates during the crucial transition to secondary education. The project focuses on language enrichment, leadership workshops, and character-building activities, with progress closely monitored through pre- and post-assessments to evaluate improvements in language proficiency, grades, and socio-emotional development.

Additionally, the program features a 21-day Total Empowerment Camp (TEC) designed to enhance students'



confidence and address academic challenges. This immersive residential experience fosters leadership, communication, and personal growth while allowing facilitators to build

trust with participants, resulting in significant gains in confidence, communication skills, and overall classroom engagement.

Namma Veetu Ponggal & MySkills Open Day

Ponggal is a traditional harvest festival celebrating the start of the harvest season. It spans four days, with the main day, Thai Ponggal, dedicated to offering thanks to the sun god for a bountiful harvest. Families gather to prepare “ponggal,” a special dish made from freshly harvested rice, cane sugar, and milk, which is then offered as a gesture of gratitude. The festival is also a time for social gatherings, traditional games, and colorful decorations, symbolizing renewal, prosperity, and thanksgiving.

At MySkills, we embraced this spirit of gratitude and community with our event, “Namma Veetu Ponggal,” which means “Ponggal at Our Home,” hosted on our Kalumpang campus. The event welcomed students, parents, alumni, donors, supporters, volunteers, and partners to celebrate together.



Starting at 8:00 a.m. on January 28th, various booths were set up, offering breakfast prepared by our students, followed by the traditional making of ponggal. The day was filled with cultural performances, including bharatanatyam and a silambam (martial arts) demonstration, as well as special performances by our students. Other activities included a coloring competition, kolam rangoli, thoranam making, and flower garland making, all adding to the festive atmosphere.



This event was not only a celebration of life on campus but also an expression of gratitude for the continued support MySkills has received over the years. It also marked our first open day since the COVID-19 pandemic began. The day concluded with an open-air movie screening, or “tent kottai,” a tradition where communities come together to watch a movie under the stars. We hope to continue fostering this spirit of togetherness as we pursue our mission at MySkills Foundation with renewed appreciation.



Total Empowerment Camp 2024



The Total Empowerment Camp (TEC) is an annual 21-day immersion program hosted at our Kalumpang and Kangar Pulai campuses, specifically designed for UPSR-leavers from vernacular schools. The camp aims to reduce dropout risks among students who face challenges such as poor grades and limited language fluency.

The camp provides a safety net for these students by focusing on confidence-building, social skills development, and language immersion. It also introduces vocational skills training as an alternative pathway for students who may not thrive in traditional academic settings. In 2024, a total of 120 high-risk students participated - 90 at Kalumpang and 60 at the Kaarainagar Fraternity Center in Kangkar Pulai - selected based on socioeconomic, academic, and exposure-related risk factors.



These students continue to receive support through the YouLead program, which offers mentorship and guidance throughout their secondary school years. YouLead helps ensure a sustainable educational experience, identifying unique talents and addressing potential risks, empowering students to reach their full potential.

The month of Ramadan in Malaysia is also a time to celebrate the ties between people - family, friends and the wider community. In the spirit of Ramadan, MySkills Foundation held our annual Iftar celebration on our Kalumpang campus as a way to show appreciation for our community partners.

The facilities built provide opportunities for daily fitness training and allows us to conduct team building activities amongst the residents on campus and also visitors from camps, schools and the surrounding neighbourhood. Creador Foundation has also taken a big step in assisting MySkills Foundation in our self-sustainability efforts by kickstarting the Endowment Fund initiative.

J.P.Morgan

J.P. Morgan and MySkills first collaborated in 2018 to equip underprivileged youths with technical and soft skills that are applicable across a number of different sectors. The latest partnership is a 2-year training program aimed at preparing 400 at-risk youths for roles and careers in electrics, plumbing, and maintenance.



MySkills' partnership with HSBC focused on the bank's sustainability pillar aligned to future skills and added greater value for sustainable transformation journey for the last three years in terms of human capital, skills competency and enterprising value-based education.



Yayasan Hasanah became a MySkills Foundation funding partner in 2016. They have sponsored a total of 40 at-risk youth who are undergoing transformation training in MySkills. In the year 2018, they have sponsored a total of 50 students for a total of two years transformation training in MySkills.



In line with the global Credit Suisse vision of a more inclusive future where all people can access the resources needed and develop the financial, entrepreneurial and other skills to thrive in the modern economy and society, the Credit Suisse APAC Foundation started supporting MySkills Foundation in late 2019 through a three-year grant and access to capacity building opportunities. The grant was extended in 2022 for a second cycle of three years, aiming to support MySkills training program until the end of 2025.



Better Malaysia Foundation had been supporting MySkills cause since 2019 via Deepavali CSR event headed by Berjaya Group. Currently, Better Malaysia Foundation had committed to support MySkills Foundation with annual operational grant of RM 250,000 over the next 10 years starting from year 2023.



MySkills Foundation had partnered with MCEF over the years of 2016, 2021 & 2022 to support the Holistic Transformation Skills Training. The sponsorship covers training cost for 18-20 students on average via the annual grant awarded to impact the holistic training at MySkills Campus.

In the beginning of 2024, MySkills had the privilege to partner with KUOK FOUNDATION to support 15 MySkills youth beneficiaries on their holistic transformation skills training. Kuok Foundation had been impacting Malaysian community in the education ecosystem with a strong philosophy more than 5 decades and we are proud to have this valued partnership.

In 2024, MySkills has partnered with the Yayasan Tunku Abdul Rahman (Y TAR) to sponsor 12 youths, who will participate in a Holistic Transformation Skills Training Program. This collaboration aligns with Y TAR's mission to empower communities through education, social welfare, and capacity building. The foundation aims to uplift marginalized groups by providing scholarships, vocational training, and mentorship programs, ultimately enhancing employability and skills development for the beneficiaries.



KLK Berhad has partnered with MySkills since 2019 under the education pillar led by their young, talented leaders. In 2019, KLK offered internship opportunities under their KLK Oleomas operations in Pulau Indran. Currently, KLK has engaged MyReaders to initiate a literacy program at the MySkills Campus. KLK has also sponsored the construction of the Female Hostel Residence Staff Apartment facilities on campus.



The Sekhar Foundation has assisted MySkills with capital expenditure for the construction of the Tan Sri B.C. Sekhar Centre for Skills & Innovation building. Under the philanthropic leadership of Dato' Dr. Vinod Sekhar, the Sekhar Foundation looks into expanding facilities in order to add value to the 'enabling environment' on the MySkills campus.

The project was successfully completed in March 2020 and officially launched in July 2020. The cafeteria provides on-campus catering to MySkills Foundation beneficiaries.



Amalan Setar (M) Sdn. Bhd is committed to their corporate responsibility efforts by sponsoring the construction of the Male Hostel Residence on the MySkills Campus. This residence is able to accommodate a total of 250 male students. The new hostel facilities provide greater value in terms of conduciveness in facilitating the development of independent living skills.

Under the leadership of Datuk AP Sivam, the CSR initiative from APS Manja Sdn Bhd provided a brand-new Van for MySkills Campus use. The sponsored 15 seater Van enabled MySkills to transport the students for On Job Trainings and Learning trips towards industrial and external programs.



Kechara Soup Kitchen Society has been an instrumental partner in assisting the MySkills cause for self-sustainability by providing consistent food supplies that impacts savings in terms of our operational expenditure. The society's services in creating a food bank and empowerment programmes over the years are commendable in terms of consistency and outreach, especially towards NGOs like MySkills Foundation that serve marginalised communities.



One of the organisations with strong corporate responsibility towards community welfare and creatively engages NGOs like MySkills in order to deliver holistic impact. REX not only helps out MySkills with operational assistance but also promotes our social enterprise (De'Divine Café) through their REX Feed The Homeless program.



Simbiotik Technologies had been instrumental to develop the Digital imprint for MySkills cause via its pro bono Mobile Apps development. Two mobile apps had been developed and currently operational to track and monitor on the two important areas of Holistic Transformation Skills Training and Primus Wellness' social entrepreneurship training.



MySkills had the privilege to be selected as the Non Profit partner with Microsoft under its Benevity portal and Microsoft Tech for Social Impact. Provided with the donated Azure credits, MySkills best optimised the Cloud storage services for two of its Mobile Apps.



The Lost Food Project currently contributes vegetables and dry goods to our Kalumpang campus on a weekly basis as part of their programme. Through their contributions, we are able to better sustain our cafeteria's operations as well as further develop our cafeteria menu.



The Able Group contributes necessities towards our cafeteria operations, such as cooking oil, condensed and evaporated milk on a monthly basis. As long time supporters of the MySkills cause, they have since offered internship placements to three of our students who will be joining Able Dairies after Deepavali 2023.



Bursa Malaysia had sponsored 20 students in 2023 from our Bakery & Pastry, Culinary and Organic Farming skills training courses for a 12 month-cycle. They have also supported us through booking our catering services for various corporate events.



In 2024, MySkills partnered with the Micron Foundation to launch The Job Placement & Monitoring Support initiative. This program aims to empower graduates from their vocational training by facilitating job placements in their trained fields and providing 12 months of ongoing support for a smooth transition to independent living. The initiative emphasizes active engagement, encouraging all graduates to participate in group support activities to create a strong network for their ongoing development.



The "Rags to Riches" workshop, hosted by MySkills in partnership with Edwards Lifesciences Malaysia, engaged MySkills students in crafting heart-shaped pillows from recycled materials, highlighting sustainable practices. The event inspired students through hands-on learning and a prior visit to Edwards Lifesciences. This initiative empowered the students to embrace sustainability and positively impact their communities.



The partnership between Baker Hughes and MySkills Foundation has flourished since 2022, focusing on empowering youth through collaborative initiatives. Key projects include the STEM Innovation Centre, which inspires a passion for STEM and equips youth with essential skills and Volunteering session which facilitated creative connections between MySkills beneficiaries and Baker Hughes employees. MySkills is grateful for Baker Hughes' continued support and commitment to creating brighter futures for youth.

BACKGROUND OF MYSKILLS FOUNDATION

- A. MySkills was formally registered on 3.3.2011. Primary objective of MySkills is to provide a SECOND opportunity (to many it is ONLY opportunity) to transform and acquire a skill. With the acquired skills, they are free to lead a decent and crime free life. MySkills works with only dropout and at-risk students from the tender age of 13 to 17 years old.
- B. Every year approximately 150 students graduate from MySkills with a government recognised skills training certificate and gainfully employed.

CURRENT FINANCIAL STATUS

1. As of December 2024, all students are provided with transformation and skills training together with meal and accommodation at no cost.
2. It cost RM 15,000 to maintain a student for a year at MySkills. This includes cost of transformation, skills training, accommodation, trainees' salary, Campus upkeep and maintenance.

3. On an average, we require RM 3 Million a year to meet the Operational and Capital Expenditures. From January 2011 to December 2024, we have spent **RM 39.3 million** to meet the Operational Expenditure and **RM 21 Million** for the Capital Expenditure (Please refer to the table below):

4. Assuming in 2011, we had an Endowment Fund of RM 30 million, the income from the Endowment Fund would have taken care of the Operational expenses while maintaining the capital of the Endowment Fund of RM 30 Million.

5. In short, our ultimate aim is the income from the Endowment Fund will take of MySkills Foundation Operational expenses **perpetually**.

WHAT IS AN ENDOWMENT FUND

Endowment operates like an EPF, a Pension Fund of a person after his retirement from a non-governmental organization (NGO). Endowment Fund is a financial asset, typically held by the NGO that is invested to generate income over the long term. The principal amount of the Endowment Fund is usually kept intact, while the income generated from the investments is used for Operational expenses, progress or any other permitted initiations of the organisation.

Key Features of an Endowment Fund :

- 1. Permanent Capital :**
The principal amount is preserved to ensure the fund can generate income indefinitely.
- 2. Investment Income:**
The fund generates income through various investments, such as stocks, bonds, or real estate.
- 3. Spending Policy :**
Organizations often have a specific policy that defines how much of the generated income can be spent each year.

IMPORTANCE OF ENDOWMENT FUND FOR FINANCIAL SUSTAINABILITY OF NGO'S

- 1. Steady Revenue Stream :**
Endowment funds provide a consistent and predictable source of income, which can help NGOs manage their finances more effectively and plan for the long term.
- 2. Financial Stability :**
With endowment funds, NGOs can reduce their reliance on fluctuating donation levels and grants, making them less vulnerable to economic downturns or changes in funding landscapes.
- 3. Capacity for Long-term Planning :**
The steady income enables NGOs to engage in strategic planning, allowing them to invest in larger projects or initiatives without the constant pressure of fundraising.

4. Increased Credibility :

A well-managed endowment fund can enhance an NGO's reputation and credibility with donors, showing that the organization is committed to long-term sustainability and responsible financial management.

5. Support for Mission :

Endowment funds can help ensure that an organization's mission continues to be funded over time, ensuring that valuable programs and services can persist and grow.

FUTURE SUSTAINABILITY OF MYSKILLS FOUNDATION

- A. From Students – MySkills spends on the average RM 45,000 to maintain a student at MySkills for the period of 3 years. At the end of the course, MySkills wants the student to be financially responsible by paying maximum RM 10,000 to MySkills for future financial sustenance.

From this stream, MySkills may be able to raise **RM 800,000 to RM 1,000,000** per year.

- B. We have regular monthly donors who contribute **RM 40,000** a month (ranging from RM 50 to RM 1,000).

- C. Assuming MySkills managed to create an **Endowment Fund of RM 20 Million**. Based on 8% return, MySkills may be able to raise **RM 1,600,000**.

- D. The regular financial grants from individuals and corporation will be added to the Endowment Fund.

PLANS TO RAISE THE CAPITAL FUND FOR THE ENDOWMENT FUND.

As of 1st December 2024, our Endowment Fund status is at RM 3.5 Million.

We need to raise RM 16.5 Million to achieve our target by 2027.

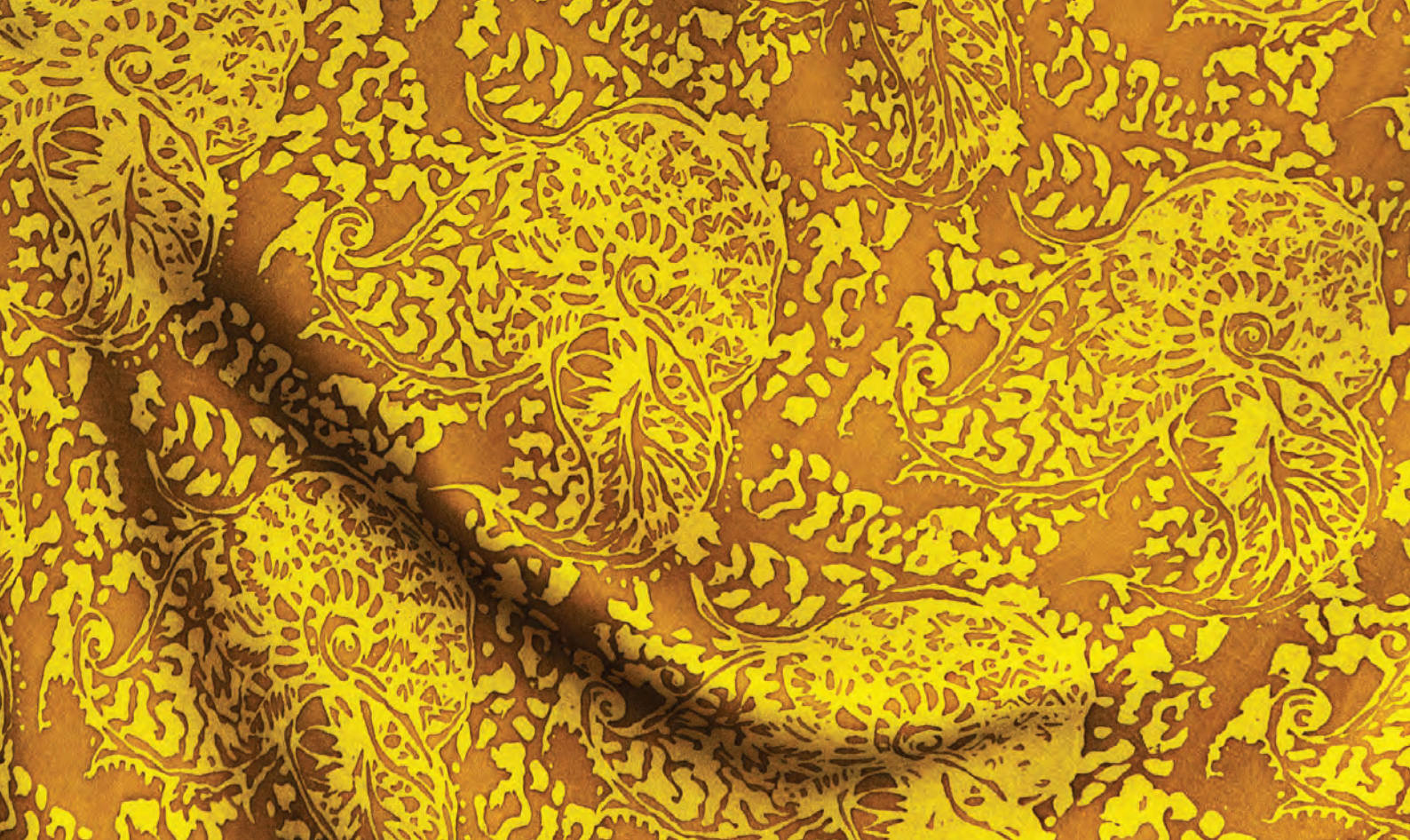
