Last three years were the busiest in MySkills campus history with about RM10 million worth of projects were under construction, including several new and renovated buildings. Thanks to the government and public funding, scores of projects have been completed in MySkills Campus Kalumpang, including major infrastructure work, renovated classrooms and facilities, training complexes, and athletic fields. The campus can now accommodate 500 student to undergo social transformation and vocational training.

As we know, MySkills Foundation has many programs, functions and roles which assist underprivileged and at risk youth to become empowered, and eventually attain sustainable development. However the bitter truth is we still rely on money from a variety of sources, including individual donors, foundations, corporations, and government to achieve this. At times we are tied to where the money comes from, dramatically affecting our effectiveness and neutrality. While there are NGOs that refuse to accept government or corporate funding to stay independent in their decision making MySkills still depends on these funding sources in order to operate. Funding issues have become particularly challenging, following the pandemic crisis.

Relying on various source of funds is less likely to render financial sustainability for MySkills. Many leaders I speak with are considering moving the model from that of a donor-funded and traditional non-governmental organization toward a sustainable social enterprise. All these point to one thing: There is great need for MySkill Foundation to change from a traditional NGO to an organization that can think creatively, act independently and account for its actions openly.

Thus, MySkills initiated Primus Wellness, a social enterprise in 2019. Primus Wellness Sdn Bhd is relatively a new company that offers all kinds of health and wellness products. They range from products to improve overall health, facial skin, health supplements and many others. Not just focusing on sales, Primus Wellness run capacity building programmes to develop community capacities such as ability, skills and knowledge of mobilizing resources, planning and evaluating challenges to gain the mastery over their lives. It also motivates the community to participate in the business and improve quality of their lives and be self-reliant.

Primus Wellness is a business-hybrid. We created Primus Wellness as a finance provider for MySkills. It is a bold move but much necessary to furthering MySkills' mission. Profit is not a dirty word in the development and aid sector, and once everyone understands that a reasonable surplus actually ensures sustainability and independence from donors I am sure you will support our new venture enthusiastically. Every contribution, however big or small, is so valuable for our sustainability.

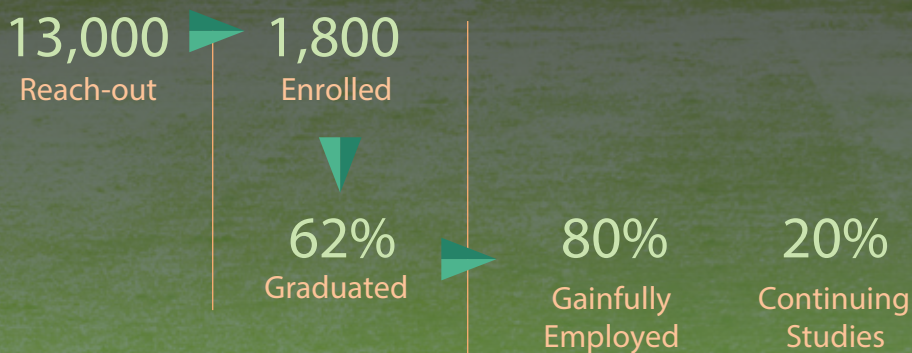

# OUR SOCIAL ENTERPRISES



Primus Institute of Technology in the new facelift episode of MySkills-Campus development chapter is currently evolving with enhanced capacity for Holistic Skills Training Development. Compared to its earlier training delivery experience (2 years in Puchong-Shop Lot and 6 years in Port Klang Bus Station Terminal), the current facilities provide not just “training competencies” but allow “in house internships” as the environment in MySkills Campus enables Entrepreneurial Training for the long run.

The opportunity to be exposed to real time construction within MySkills Campus that enabled 50-60% of the students to be exposed for On Job Training for almost 2 years and it is still on-going.

The new training facilities such as tutorial rooms and training bays created for Electrical Wiring, Air-Conditioning, Welding, Plumbing, Corporate Secretarial and Hair Dressing provide conducive environment for Multi-Skilling which is highly crucial for job market needs. Together with our active facilities of Cafeteria with Learning Kitchen and Organic Farming, we also cultivate On Job Skills for Culinary, Pastry and Farming skills too.

Currently, the total capacity for residential based program in MySkills Campus had increased to accommodate 300 students (including Boys and Girls). Primus Institute of Technology (MySkills) hopes these batch of multi-skilled candidates not only carry versatile skills upon graduation but also carry great potential Enterprise for personal development after 2-3 years of working experience.



# OUR SOCIAL ENTERPRISES



The main aim of Organic Farming is to reduce the cost of vegetable purchasing in campus to ZERO and produce chemical free vegetables to our students, supporters and donors. Besides that, Organic farming is aimed to enhance sustainable farming awareness and vocational skills for the youth beneficiaries at MySkills by equipping them with knowledge and skills in sustainable farming.

The organic farming is carried out by 10-15 full time students on daily basis, approximately spending 4 to 6 hours to do the activities like preparing soil, making bed rows, manuring the soil, propagation, watering, pesticide, and weeding. They are also involved in the end process of harvesting for vegetable, maintaining fruit trees like manuring, watering, spraying pesticide, pruning, waste food composting, and creating vermicomposting plots used as fertilizer for the farming in our campus.

The students learn the process of planting a vegetable, maintaining fruits and tropical trees which make them exciting towards harvesting the crops in which they proud of their effort. The other students contribute their 1 hour on daily basis to the environment under the banner of Green Hour.

As of now, Vegetables like Kangkung, Spinach, Brinjal, Ladies finger (Okra), Sawi (Mustard), Long Beans, Bottle Gourd, Bitter Gourd, Snake Gourd, Pumpkin, Sour Spinach, Cucumber, Cabbage, Pudina, Corriander and fruits like Papaya, Guava, Lime, Jackfruit, Kedundung, Mango, Banana, Passion Fruit are cultivated by the boys to supply for cafeteria usage regularly.

Recently we partnered again with UNDP-GEF Small Grants Project to expand the Organic Farming plans. Now, we are proud to see evolution of Self-Sustenance is being achieved through Organic Way of Life.

**Primus Wellness** is a truly Malaysian venture benefiting Malaysians at various levels. As sales persons do not put cash up front, cash flow is an issue when sales are slow or delayed, so at this time donations are still needed. As Pope Francis recently said "We are all born to help each another. No matter how difficult it is, life is good when you are happy but much better when others are happy because of you".

MySkills Foundation has been striving to become self-sufficient financially and not be dependant on donors. One effort to achieving this goal was to set up a subsidiary: "Primus Wellness" about one year ago. A truly Malaysian effort. Primus Wellness in partnership with Malay and Chinese entrepreneurs produces organic health products. These are then marketed to the public by Malaysians in the B40 socioeconomic group. Through fortnightly lectures, tutorials on sale techniques, role play and roubleshooting sessions these micro entrepreneurs are trained to engage with the public and sell the products.

### **This effort has multiple benefits:**

- A steady source of income for MySkills to run its programs
- Enable citizens in the B40 group to develop their confidence and skills and stand on their feet to become self-sufficient and not depend on handouts
- In the long term these micro entrepreneurs could set up their own businesses.



# OUR SOCIAL ENTREPRENEURS



" Mdm Maruthayi came through as intelligent, very hardworking, and talented. Failure was not an option for her. Aged 47 years, she married at 26 and has 9 children. Her husband is a factory worker whose earnings are not enough to support the needs of her family. A wiry lady who sleeps only 3 – 4 hours every day, by self-admission she works non-stop. Maruthayi does every honest job that comes her way to provide for her family; she cleans peoples' homes and has built a reputation for her work. She also provides post-partum care for both others and their newborn – she says her massaging techniques enables the infant to sleep soundly and the mother to regain her shape in record time she earnestly believes that the God she prays to gives her the skills.



" Mdm Maslinda Othman is a single mother. Her husband passed on and she has a 18 year old son who will be joining a government skills training institute soon. With a monthly income of RM2000 she is hard pressed to fulfil all her family's needs. Born in an estate in Kulim her multilingual skills include speaking Tamil. She has experienced personal benefits with Primus Wellness products and so, armed with this and good communication and networking skills (she posts on WhatsApp and other social media platforms) Maslinda has been successful in selling the herbs – a testimony to her success is the many repeat sales she has had. Maslinda's mother Puan Lijah Sapparee is a strong motivating force encouraging her daughter never to give up. "



" Mdm Low Bee Bee, is a single mother. Her husband abandoned her and her 2 children now aged 17 and 20. Her son scored 10As and is currently pursuing optometry at University Kebangsaan. A highly energetic person with good communication skills, Bee Bee is multilingual. To put food on the family table Bee Bee has driven Grab cars, sold organic farm products like kampung eggs and provided transportation for school children. She was introduced to Primus Wellness by Mr Tet Wong, who used to supply her with organic products to sell. Incidentally, Mr Tet Wong was instrumental in Primus Wellness producing organic herbal products – he taught them the process of making products from the Moringa oleifera tree (superfood). "



" Mdm Kasthuri is 33 years old. She suffers from epilepsy. Her husband was blinded in a motor vehicle accident (hit and run). They have 4 growing children and desperately need money. She has tried the herbal products from Primus Wellness which she said has cured her of her insomnia, headaches and body aches. Her brother a milk vendor found that his joint pains improved tremendously after using the products. Armed with personal experience which she shares with her customers, Kasthuri makes her sales – being successful as a salesperson, has enabled her confidence to grow. With his own experience, Kasthuri's brother helps her promote her products with his own customers. 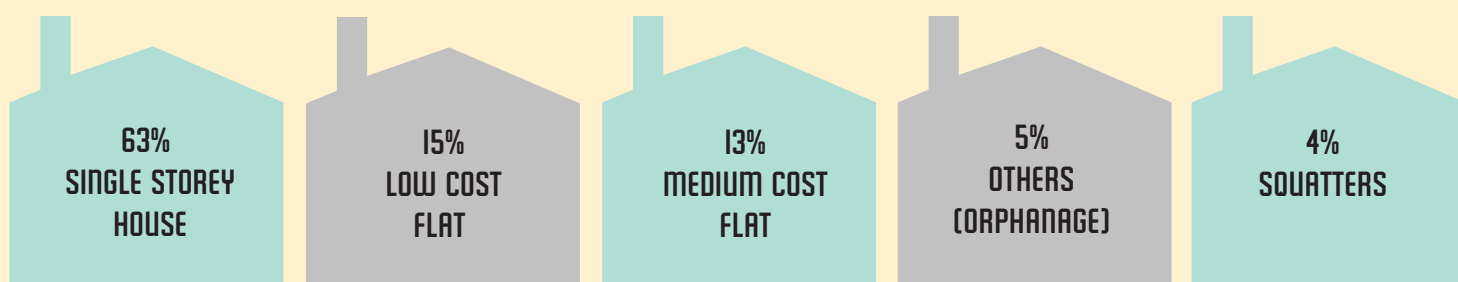

# MAJOR FUNDING PARTNERS

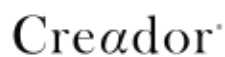
