MySkills Foundation purchased 34 acres of land in Kalumpang, Hulu Selangor to build our Youth & Entrepreneurship Campus in 2018. With a maximum capacity of 500 students, we pride ourselves on remaining operational for in-person training during the COVID-19 pandemic.

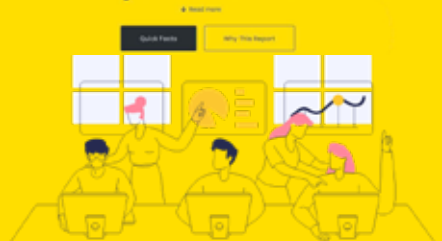
#### Kangar Pulai Satellite Centre

In 2023, MySkills Foundation was listed as one of the top 10 foundations in Malaysia that have the highest transparency score according to Wiki Impact. A total of 1,567 registered foundations were surveyed and MySkills is honored to be listed within the Top 10.

#### Accredited Charity (2015 - 2022)

From 2015 to 2022, MySkills Foundation was a tax-exempt organisation sanctioned by the Malaysian Ministry of Finance. Later, MySkills was also recognised as a US Public Charity equivalent, validated by several organisations including NGOsource, Global Giving, Blackbaud, Tech Soup and the Silicon Valley Community Foundation.



#### World Bank Report

MySkills Foundation served as a case study and became a recommended course of action to the Malaysian government in a study conducted by the World Bank, Economy Planning Unit (EPU) and Khazanah Nasional. Their report 'Achieving A System of Competitive Cities in Malaysia' highlighted the MySkills Foundation intervention model as worthy of scaling and replicated in other population areas with critical numbers of at-risk youth.



#### Malaysian Indian Blueprint

MySkills Foundation served as a case study and was modelled as a recommended transformation approach under the Malaysian Indian Blueprint in 2016.



#### Tan Kah Kee Award

MySkills Foundation was honoured to receive the Tan Kah Kee award in 2018 from the Tan Kah Kee Foundation, in recognition for achieving outstanding community (youth) development milestones.



#### KABALI Film

MySkills Foundation inspired the director of KABALI, Pa Ranjith who spoke about MySkills Foundation and the storyline of KABALI, relating it to the 'Free Life Foundation' in the movie.



#### JAGAT Film

MySkills Foundation co-produced the film, JAGAT - known as the best Malaysian movie of 2016. The movie won several awards for accurately depicting the plight of Malaysian Indians during the post-estate era and their survival during harsh circumstances.



#### Social Enterprises

MySkills Foundation has founded a total of Six (6) social enterprises since 2010, in pursuit of self-sustainability.



#### cafe de'divine

One of our social enterprises, MyBakery was later. Rebranded to De'Divine Café and won the British Council's 'Entrepreneurs for Good' Wave 3 Award in year 2016.

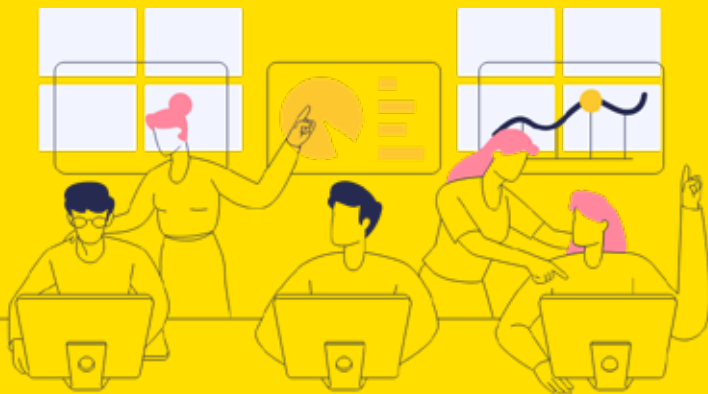

The comprehensive rating system evaluated the transparency, frequency and credibility of communications made by registered foundations to the public.

## Creador Foundation

Creador Foundation is an entity that gives beyond traditional grant giving while believing in empowering local communities so that they can take ownership of their own lives, thus becoming primary agents for change.

In 2014, MySkills Foundation had the privilege of receiving Mr. Brahmal Vasudevan, co-founder of Creador Foundation at our MySkills Youth Transformation Centre in Port Klang. During the exchange, we were able to have a fruitful exchange discussing the MySkills cause and future plans towards providing a more enabling environment by developing our own campus. At the time, Mr. Brahmal pledged his support towards the construction of the campus.

The MySkills Board of Directors believe that being self-sustainable is the next step forward for the foundation to continue serving the beneficiaries without disruption, especially with regards to financial security.

We have since initiated the MySkills Foundation Endowment Fund, with a target of RM 20 million. As the years passed, we carried the aspiration to further align with Creador Foundation's philanthropic goals and received sponsorship for the construction of a five-station obstacle course, completed in 2020.



Since then, Ms. Shanthi Kandiah and Mr. Brahmal Vasudevan contributed RM 3 million in 2021, and later an additional RM 2 million in 2023 - bringing the total contribution to RM 5 million.

Our beneficiaries and the local community are actively using this obstacle course in their daily fitness training at our Youth Transformation and Entrepreneurship Campus in Kalumpang, Hulu Selangor and we are grateful for Creador Foundation's commitment towards developing long-term solutions for pressing social dilemmas, such as at-risk youth interventions. We look forward to eventful, impactful outcomes from this partnership.







## Better Malaysia Foundation

**B**etter Malaysia Foundation was launched year 2000, supporting various community and charitable causes which include educational programmes, medical and health causes and humanitarian aid.

In November 2019, Dato' Sri Robin Tan Yeong Ching and 17 top delegates from Berjaya Group spent an entire day at MySkills Youth Transformation and Entrepreneurship Campus to explore the MySkills cause with our team during the Deepavali celebrations. The Berjaya Group Leaders were addressed and briefed by our director, Mr. Pasupathi Sithamparam on our humble beginnings and the progress of the campus thus far.

Dato' Sri Robin Tan mentioned that the founder of Berjaya Group, Tan Sri Vincent Tan would be the ideal person to pledge significant support for the MySkills cause and we kept the hope to get the right opportunity for this.

In 2023, Tan Sri Vincent Tan was introduced to MySkills via a fundraising dinner which was organised at Tiki Taka restaurant with the support of Mr. Mathu Marimuthu. Tan Sri Vincent mentioned that he was enlightened on the MySkills cause by Dato' Sri Robin Tan in the past years.

Tan Sri Vincent Tan pledged that Better Malaysia Foundation will support 10% of MySkills annual operational expenditure, which translates to RM 250,000 annually over the next 10 years; in total, it was RM 2.5 million pledged and we were totally overwhelmed by his kindness.

During our annual fundraiser and appreciation dinner in 2023, we were honored to have our alumni, Kamal be the recipient of the mock cheque presented by Dato' Sri Robin Tan on behalf of the Better Malaysia Foundation. Kamal, alumnus of 2013, is currently working as a Senior Technician with U Mobile, under the Berjaya group of companies.







## J.P. Morgan

J.P. Morgan's ongoing support for MySkills Foundation provides transformative skills training for disadvantaged youth in Malaysia. To date, 300 students have gone through the program at the MySkills campus and successfully secured employment post-completion of their training. The current partnership, implemented over 24 months, provides 400 at-risk students with training focused on high-income job placements and the ability to pursue higher education opportunities. The training streams include corporate secretarial and caregiving as well as pilot programming aimed to assist selected youth in completing their education qualifications and building new self-employment related skills and mindset training.

In September 2023, MySkills Foundation welcomed 30 employee volunteers from J.P. Morgan for an activity-filled day at the Kalumpang campus. The volunteers engaged student participants in activities from plant propagation to pastry making, getting to know them better on an individual level. All participants and volunteers were also treated to joint performances by the urumi and lion dance teams and a talent showcase including dance and choral speaking performances.







## HSBC - Achievement Day 2022/23

In May 2023, MySkills Foundation together with HSBC celebrated the successful graduation of 100 youths that were a part of the 2022 'Green Workforce Readiness with Solar PV' skills training programme. The 'Achievement Day' event was officiated by the Hon. Deputy Minister of Youth & Sports, YB Adam Adli.

The Public Private Partnership between HSBC and MySkills over the last 6 years has generated long term impact for the B40 community especially for at risk youth. This includes equipping youth with the requisite skills for a bright future while also enhancing their social wellbeing.

In his keynote address, YB Adam Adli commended the efforts of HSBC Malaysia and MySkills for providing invaluable training opportunities, job placements and monitoring support to these young Malaysians. Through this, the partnership has ensured that these youth have the necessary resources for success in their chosen career path.

According to Malaysia's Green Technology Master Plan, the nation is aiming to create more than 200,000 green jobs by 2030. Dato' Omar Siddiq, CEO of HSBC Malaysia reaffirmed their commitment to working with the Malaysian government to build the future skills of the communities they serve across a range of areas including sustainability. He also stated that they were especially proud of HSBC's partnership with MySkills Foundation particularly in the continuing effort to upskill youths.

MySkills firmly believes to prepare the students for a changing world, education must address workforce trends in connection to social and economic development. Under MySkills current ecosystem, the training emphasises more on sustainable human capital development solutions which also addresses entrepreneurship capacity building for the at-risk youths.

During the event, MySkills signed an MoU with Charge N Go Sdn. Bhd. for the future training on Electrical Vehicles (EV).







## Yayasan Hasanah

Yayasan Hasanah, a foundation under Khazanah Nasional, is an independent grant-making foundation with a focus on the pressing community, social, and environmental issues in Malaysia.

MySkills Foundation has been partnering with Yayasan Hasanah for the period of 2016 - 2018 and 2018 - 2020. The objectives of the past partnerships focused on holistic transformation for at-risk vulnerable youths. The specific outcomes were measuring gainful employment, leading a better quality of life, and becoming change agent to realise their own self-worth and cease from indulging in anti-social behaviour or crime.

For the renewed partnership in 2022, we are targeting to retain the holistic objectives of transformation-based skills training and embed the entrepreneurship development under the sustainable human capital outcomes. The essential long-term goals of this project targets successful graduates from these B40/B20 families to elevate their socioeconomic status into mainstream society.







## Partnership with Credit Suisse APAC Foundation & Volunteering Day 2023



In the past five years, MySkills has been privileged to receive steadfast support from the Credit Suisse APAC Foundation and Corporate Citizenship team. The grant (two cycles of 3-years) from the Credit Suisse APAC Foundation has been instrumental in our mission to transform the lives of at-risk youth, equipping them with the skills they need for a brighter future.

In October 2023, MySkills Foundation Kalumpang was honoured to host 22 employees from Credit Suisse (based in the Singapore and Malaysia offices). This adds great value to our partnership, with various representatives from Credit Suisse witnessing the evolution of our Kalumpang campus from 2019 to the present day.

During their visit, Credit Suisse employees had the opportunity to explore our 34-acre campus and engage with our student beneficiaries, allowing them to experience the impact our cause has had on these students.

From a wholesome banana leaf lunch prepared by our culinary students to team-based telematics activities, we aimed to provide the team with a glimpse into the campus life episodes of a MySkills student.

Furthermore, the Credit Suisse volunteers conducted invaluable workshops, sharing insights on critical modern workforce skills, including financial literacy, presentation skills, and cybersecurity. These sessions equipped our students with essential knowledge and guidance for navigating the digital skills development.

We extend our heartfelt gratitude to the Credit Suisse volunteers for their unwavering support and their generous donation of USD 8,300, collected from a recent fund raising drive supporting MySkills cause. Your dedication and commitment to spending an entire day with our student beneficiaries is truly appreciated. We look forward to the possibility of continuing collaborative journey in the future.







## Malaysian Community & Education Foundation

The Malaysian Community & Education Foundation (MCEF) provides financial assistance to Malaysians who have either inadequate or no other means of financial support to pursue their education. MCEF also provides grants to assist organisations in looking into the needs of deserving individuals / community in the areas of Education, Community Welfare and Community Development.

MySkills Foundation has been partnering with MCEF since 2016 up until present day. Recently in April 2023, we received a visit by one of the directors of MCEF, Mr. Sathish Ramachandran to see the impact from the partnership between MySkills cause and MCEF in person. After meeting the beneficiaries, Mr. Sathish shared encouraging feedback on how the cause should be upscaled to serve more beneficiaries.

Mr. Sreenadh and Ms. Punitha from the Grant Management team also visited the MySkills campus for a monitoring visit in June 2023. They met with 20 student beneficiaries sponsored by MCEF and got the feedback and progress report.

As one of the significant impacts from this partnership, some of the MCEF beneficiaries have the opportunity to render air-conditioning services at MCEF premises in Brickfields, Kuala Lumpur. We are proud that the skills gained is put into good use and meaningful outcomes.





## Malaysian Indian Transformation Unit (MITRA)

MySkills is blessed to have received continuous support from the Malaysian Indian Transformation Unit (MITRA) over the years. Their vision of transforming Malaysian Indians into a resilient community through empowerment of various sectors is in alignment with the MySkills mission to transform at-risk youth into successful, responsible citizens.

For the 2022/2023 grant cycle, MITRA sponsored a total of 40 students in the electrical wiring SKM course. This main target for this cohort of students was to develop their entrepreneurship skills through exposure to various hands-on opportunities and mindset development.

Altogether, officials from MITRA had visited Myskills Campus 3 times for their monitoring visit, where they were able to see these students' progress in person.







## A Day with Resort World Genting (First World Hotel)

Genting Group Malaysia sponsored the construction of the Cafeteria & Learning Kitchen at the MySkills Foundation Youth Transformation & Entrepreneurship Campus as part of their Community Project, whereby construction was completed in 2020.

The existence of this learning kitchen allows the culinary students to participate in regular culinary, pastry and bakery training sessions. Utilising the provided training resources and facilities, these students are handling both internal and external catering services at MySkills.

In February 2023, as a follow up to the previous year's industrial visit - 15 students accompanied by 3 staff members had the opportunity to go for an industrial visit to the centralised kitchen and F&B outlets in Resort World Genting. The focus for this visit was to provide hands-on experience that granted exposure to Genting's operational functionality on a day-to-day basis, in order to apply relevant learning outcomes to the training pathway on-campus as well as offer internship and work opportunities to our students.

The students were given a tour of the centralised kitchen, focusing on innovative features such as their live lobster tank and their bakery facilities. The students were also given valuable insight into the importance of precision and waste reduction during bakery and preparation, explained to them by Chef Zul. The tour also took the students through the facilities available.







## Bursa Malaysia

In 2023, Bursa Malaysia sponsored a total of 20 students with a focus on the culinary and organic farming students over the course of a 12 month training period. The sponsorship of these students is meant to support the holistic intervention and transformation method designed by MySkills Foundation.

These students are currently going through the holistic transformation and skills training residential program on our Kalumpang campus. Through that, they are guided through the fundamentals of their respective skills training courses as well as given valuable hands-on experience which will allow them to apply what they have learned in a real life situation.

We are grateful to Bursa Malaysia for believing in the MySkills cause and consistently providing us with support and opportunities. Since 2023, our cafe team has provided catering and serving services for several Bursa Malaysia events and we hope to continue this for future events.







## Baker Hughes

MySkills has embarked on developing a STEM Innovation Centre to empower young people at-risk to explore and pursue STEM fields in collaboration with Baker Hughes and Multimedia University, Cyberjaya. Through hands-on education and experiences, we aim to foster a love of STEM and to equip these young people with the skills, knowledge and confidence they need to succeed in TVET careers. The objective of this lab is to provide comprehensive education in STEM fields and bridge the gap between underrepresented groups and STEM opportunities.

Baker Hughes has pledged to develop digital and technical skills among MySkills youth beneficiaries in the effort for promoting clean energy and reducing carbon footprint. From their APAF ERG volunteer pool and local multilingual volunteers, we aim to develop relevant STEM projects related to natural resources. They have contributed USD 30,000 to support six STEM innovation projects.

In October 2022, we hosted a group of 30 volunteers from their APAF-ERG volunteer pool for a Deepavali tree planting event. With varieties of herbal, flowering and fruit trees such as hibiscus, neem and rambutan, the volunteers spent time with our students, getting to know them individually while asking them about their experiences on-campus. The visit concluded with a performance and lunch where the Baker Hughes team distributed gratitude journals and handmade bookmarks to the students.

Since then, we have since opened booths at their KL office for Deepavali as well as several other charitable events. It is our sincere hope to continue the positive impact generated by this partnership and further improve the lives of at-risk youth.

## UNDP – SGP Grantees Visit to MySkills Foundation Campus

In 2023, the GEF Small Grants Programme organised a New Grantee and Exchange Workshop for their 2023 SGP grantees, as well as a site visit to the MySkills Foundation campus in Kalumpang, Hulu Selangor. A total of seven Malaysian organisations participated in the workshop, namely PACOS Trust, Fly Technology Agriculture, Malaysian Nature Society, Borneo Komrad, Klima Action Malaysia (KAMY), Friends of Bukit Kiara (FoBK) and Gerimis. These organisations came from all over Malaysia, including Sabah and Sarawak.

The main purpose of the site visit was to give the current cohort of grantees exposure to MySkills Foundation as a past grantee who had succeeded in creating a sustainable ecosystem while uplifting marginalised youth. There was also a roundtable discussion with the attending organisations on future collaborations with MySkills. During this exchange, there was a discussion on how MySkills youth can participate in the SGP youth programs and the various Klang Valley Landscape Projects with a focus on creating a natural corridor through replanting efforts.

We are grateful to the UNDP SGP-GEF committee for organising this event and featuring us as a successful past grantee. We hope to continue our efforts and furthering the progress we have already made.







# MyFarm Lab

Established in 2021, MyFarm Lab is a social enterprise with a focus on enabling sustainability and making microgreens accessible to all. In the past year, they have scaled operations by bringing on Dr. Lee Wan Sin as their General Manager, allowing for greater innovation and experimentation. They have also had a stronger offline presence, opening booths in bazaars such as the Astra x IBU Bazaar in July 2023 where the MySkills students participating were given valuable exposure to the sales and marketing process through planning, booth set up, promotion and customer engagement.

In 2023, MyFarm Lab Chairman, Dato' Dr. Mohd Nazlee Kamal, was invited as one of the panelists for the School of Science Industry Talk Series at Monash University Malaysia. The purpose of this was to discuss the latest trends and opportunities in biotechnology. The audience for the talk included students, faculty members of the School of Science at Monash University Malaysia and the general public.

Currently, the microgreens are available for consumer purchase through their social media channels. MySkills Foundation is grateful to them for their continued support and commitment to providing valuable opportunities and exposure to our students by employing them at their facility, located on our campus. We are also appreciative of their volunteer efforts, such as chess training by Dato' Nazlee and motivational sessions with Datin Soheir.

## Kuala Lumpur Kepong Berhad & MyReaders

In 2023, 19 students were invited for an industrial visit to the KLK premises as part of their industrial development program. Students currently enrolled in the electrical wiring course were introduced to the KLK standard operating procedures as well as fundamentals on wiring, electrical work, safety and other relevant industry information.

The purpose of the visit was to give context to what they have studied and give them a sense of the application in real-life situations. KLK being a key partner for MySkills Foundation, our students were then given insight into the organisation's history and a deeper understanding of what KLK actually does.

To that effect, KLK took the students through a guided tour of their facility, giving them detailed insight in machine operation.

On the 21st of June, 2023 - MYReaders brought a group of alumni from Teach For All network partners from the Asia Pacific region namely Bangladesh, Pakistan and India to visit MySkills Foundation. The trip was organised to allow them to see and experience a local example of the wonderful ecosystem created by the Foundation for the youth to progress towards employment through skill development.

They found MySkills Foundation's focus on emotional intelligence, vocational skills, and life management to be impressive, fostering positive behavior and reducing social issues among students. The students on campus were actively engaged in various activities, including hair trimming, farming, and baking, at their own salon, garden, and kitchen respectively.

They also got to get a tour of the new, fully equipped library by the student librarians themselves who have worked very hard to curate, clean and organize the space for months. Another highlight was being able to hear from student mentors from the MYReaders reading programme themselves about their personal stories and mentorship experience. All in all, they were very grateful for the opportunity and truly inspired by the meaningful work that MySkills Foundation does for at-risk youth.

## AMKT Transformations Peer Coaching

In their 2022-23 Peer Coaching partnership with MySkills, Dr Anne Munro-Kua and her team have facilitated two extended programmes, one in 2022 with junior boys and the second in 2023, with a group of girls.

The Peer Coaching workshops are designed to ensure a safe space to support all participants in making new personal discoveries and creating new possibilities for themselves, each other and thus for society.

From the start they empower the students with proven listening and questioning skills which they learn to use to explore “how do I get angry?” and “how do I learn at my best?” Over time, the students become more self-aware, vocal and assertive. They also begin to notice much more about other people and their surrounding situations, evident when they share: “I used to talk without thinking and other people felt hurt. “Now when I am in a negative situation, I can “pause” and choose a new way to behave.”

In addition to the interactive small group workshops, they hold observed practice sessions in which students are randomly paired to coach each other in their mother tongue Tamil, on their real-life problems.

It is evident that they are now genuinely interested, welcoming each coachee with a smile, speaking more slowly and softly and holding an attitude of curiosity as they ask questions and listen closely to the responses. The coachee students report feeling much better after a coaching session often having found their own solution to a challenge they face.

Over time, this level 1 programme has achieved the collective purpose, that is, to support a shift from a focus on problem thinking to outcome thinking. The students have demonstrated honesty and bravery in acknowledging their challenges and in exchanging specific feedback, identifying what works and what doesn't.

They have witnessed how Peer Coaching skills provide a platform for students to make other changes in their lives that are leading to new academic and individual success.







## Asurion Volunteer Day

MySkills Foundation was approached by Asurion, a US based tech solutions provider, in 2022 to participate in their TechAssist program - an internship program designed to train and provide high-income work towards students from B40 backgrounds. To date, 6 students have successfully completed this internship and gone on to work as data technicians.



On the 11th of January, 2023, Asurion Malaysia brought 25 of their management team to spend the day at our Kalumpang campus, led by their General Manager, Mr. Saravanan Kollanthavelu or Mr. Sam as he's known. We are deeply appreciative of the commitment and dedication the management team of Asurion Malaysia has shown towards our students involved in the TechAssist internship, and infinitely grateful towards them for taking time out of their busy schedules in order to spend an entire day with our students - learning more about MySkills and involved in various activities planned with our students.

The event itself was concluded with a traditional yee sang celebration for the entire campus in conjunction with the 2023 Lunar New Year festivities, which in itself provided a wonderful experience for our students. Currently, we have a second batch of students currently pursuing their internship with Asurion. Five students are currently in the 2023 Internship batch, and successfully learning and growing their skill sets as data technicians.

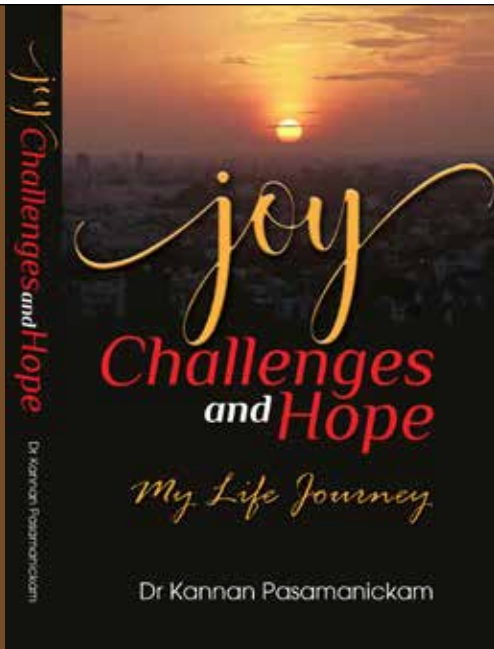

## Total Empowerment Camp & YouLead Program

The Total Empowerment Camp (TEC) program is an annual immersion camp held on our Kalumpang and Kangar Pulai campuses for UPSR-leavers from vernacular schools. The core purpose of this program is to reduce the dropout risks associated with poor grades and lack of fluency in these students.

This camp is run for 21 days and is designed to provide a safety net for these students by offering opportunities for these students to build up their confidence and social skills through language immersion activities while also creating awareness of vocational skills training as a viable alternative pathway for students who are not aligned with traditional academic learning.

A total of 120 students were enrolled in 2022, having been identified as high-risk due to socioeconomic, academic and exposure risk factors and characteristics. These students are closely monitored and also given continuous support through the YouLead program from their enrolment into secondary school until completion.

The YouLead program serves as a follow up program through mentorship and guidance for these students as they enter secondary school, with emphasis on making their experience a sustainable one. Through this initiative, it is also made possible to identify special skills and potentials as well as mitigate risks within this group of students.

And this year, we have embarked on a new community income-generation model called Pasar Pintu, an initiative run at PPRs (high rise low-cost flats) to provide income generating opportunities and build entrepreneurship skills.

We always make sure our stakeholders benefit directly from the company's growth. We have an increasingly strong interest in how we invest in managing our social, community and environmental responsibilities and how we add value in these areas. The difference between most companies and a social enterprise

like Primus Wellness is that we are a vital part of the fabric of marginalized communities. The more successful we are and the greater our profit, the more we put directly into building more entrepreneurs and income for the underprivileged.

I believe that our achievements to date demonstrates our ability to create value through a variety of economic and social environments. I would like to sincerely thank Primus Wellness team and entrepreneurs for your efforts over the years. We can be proud of many of our achievements. These record results would not be possible without your contributions.

Having said that, we must not be complacent. We know now that building a social business is not easy. But one thing is clear that it is both important and hard; and even though it is hard, we will continue to strive to maximize returns and impact to our stakeholders. MySkills social enterprises are being part of impact driven journey as Primus Wellness is on-boarded with the Program Perolehan Impak Sosial Kerajaan (PPISK), as the registered vendor under Malaysian Government e-procurement system.



Under the leadership of Datuk AP Sivam, the CSR initiative from APS Manja Sdn Bhd provided a brand-new Van for MySkills Campus use. The sponsored 15 seater Van enabled MySkills to transport the students for On Job Trainings and Learning trips towards industrial and external programs.



Kechara Soup Kitchen Society has been an instrumental partner in assisting the MySkills cause for self-sustainability by providing consistent food supplies that impacts savings in terms of our operational expenditure. The Lost Food Project currently contributes vegetables and dry goods to our Kalumpang campus on a weekly basis as part of their programme. Through their contributions, we are able to better sustain our cafeteria's operations as well as further develop our cafeteria menu.



The Able Group contributes necessities towards our cafeteria operations, such as cooking oil, condensed and evaporated milk on a monthly basis. As long time supporters of the MySkills cause, they have since offered internship placements to three of our students who will be joining Able Dairies after Deepavali 2023.
