














Earnings by Household





FATHER'S OCCUPATION

MySkills Foundation Kalumpang Campus

MySkills Foundation purchased 34 acres of land in Kalumpang, Hulu Selangor to build our Youth & Entrepreneurship Campus in 2018. With a maximum capacity of 500 students, we pride ourselves on remaining operational for in-person training during the COVID-19 pandemic lockdown.



Beyond The Bells @ After School Support at Johor

Yayasan Hasanah funded after school support program which targets Year 6 leavers to complete secondary education since year 2023.



Malaysian Indian Blueprint

MySkills Foundation served as a case study and was modelled as a recommended transformation approach under the Malaysian Indian Blueprint in 2016.



Tan Kah Kee Award

MySkills Foundation was honoured to receive the Tan Kah Kee award in 2018 from the Tan Kah Kee Foundation, in recognition for achieving outstanding community (youth) development milestones.



Accredited Charity (2015 - 2029)

From 2015 to 2022, MySkills Foundation was a tax-exempt organisation sanctioned by the Malaysian Ministry of Finance. Later, MySkills was also recognised as a US Public Charity equivalent, validated by several organisations including NGOsource, Global Giving, Blackbaud, Tech Soup and the Silicon Valley Community Foundation. Recently our tax exemption status was renewed until year 2019.




World Bank Report

MySkills Foundation served as a case study and became a recommended course of action to the Malaysian government in a study conducted by the World Bank, Economy Planning Unit (EPU) and Khazanah Nasional. This report, now in its second edition, evaluated 1,710 foundations, including a reassessment of the 1,567 foundations initially analyzed in 2022. We are pleased to have improved our transparency score from 90% to 95%, reflecting our continued commitment to openness and accountability.

On 24th April 2025, we had the distinct honour of welcoming again the Hon. Minister of Youth and Sports, YB Puan Hannah Yeoh at the MySkills Campus, to officiate the Klinik Badminton in partnership with Coach Roslin Hashim.

We are deeply grateful to the The Lee Chong Wei Foundation (Dato' Sri Lee Chong Wei) for their generous sponsorship of 50 badminton rackets, empowering our students to actively engage in sports excellence.

With the RM50,000 grant from the Ministry of Youth and Sports, MySkills has successfully developed four new badminton courts on campus, marking a significant step towards a holistic development ecosystem for our youth. Further upgrades are underway, including facilities for athletics and gym training, to ensure broader sports access for all MySkills beneficiaries.

In a show of continued support, YB Puan Hannah Yeoh has pledged an



additional RM20,000 to organise four more badminton clinics with Coach Roslin Hashim throughout 2025 - energising our students' passion for sports and teamwork.

Expanding our impact further, MySkills will open future sports clinics to include primary and secondary school students from Kalumpang, nurturing local talents and strengthening community ties.

At MySkills Foundation, we remain committed to building resilient, skilled, and dynamic youth - both on and off the court.

MySkills' Strategic Role in Malaysia's Youth Socioeconomic Empowerment Plan 2030

In 2023, MySkills Foundation, represented by CEO, Mr Devasharma was formally engaged as a key consultant for the formulation of the Pelan Pemerkasaan Sosioekonomi Belia 2030 (Youth Socioeconomic Empowerment Plan 2030) under the auspices of Institut Penyelidikan Pembangunan Belia Malaysia (IYRES), a premier youth research arm under the Ministry of Youth and Sports.

This national blueprint is a bold and strategic response by the Malaysian government to address the persistent issues of youth unemployment, social vulnerability, and the need for future-proof economic empowerment mechanisms for Malaysia's youth. The Plan is aligned with the MADANI vision and the aspirations outlined in the Twelfth Malaysia Plan, placing strong emphasis on inclusive development and national resilience.

As a recognised sanctuary and transformation hub for belia berisiko tinggi (high-risk youth), MySkills Foundation was entrusted with providing ground-level insights and strategic inputs particularly under Goal 2: Strengthening Youth Well-Being and Inclusivity. Our focus contributed significantly to the section on "Programme to Stimulate the Economic Growth of Minority and Marginalised Youth and At-Risk Youth", highlighted in Page 53, Display Box 5 of the official Plan.

The Plan outlines that:

"MySkills Foundation was established to provide protection to at-risk youth in Malaysia. Using a fully residential training method, MySkills produces responsible citizens through a Holistic Skills Training approach based on character values and skills aligned with market needs... The MySkills Holistic Transformation Skills Training model has been recognised by the World Bank, the Economic Planning Unit and Khazanah Nasional."

Our 15-year commitment to transformative human capital development has now been formally incorporated as a national best practice for inclusive economic development. This recognition validates our campus-based approach in Kalumpang, which integrates vocational training with character development, life-skills coaching, and entrepreneurship. Our Kalumpang campus is capable of housing and can train up to 400 youth simultaneously.

Through this policy milestone, MySkills has been positioned not only as a transformation centre but as a national reference model for addressing systemic youth vulnerability. The Plan explicitly lists MySkills' methodology as a reference guide for national and state-level programme implementation aimed at:

- Bridging educational and economic gaps for minority, marginalised and at-risk youth
- Empowering NEET (Not in Employment, Education or Training) youth and those without formal identification
- Strengthening advisory and support systems at district and state levels

We thank IYRES and Ministry of Youth and Sports for this recognition and we will continue to work collaboratively with stakeholders to ensure that vulnerable youth are not just protected but prepared to thrive in Malaysia's dynamic and sustainable economic future.

MySkills yang memulakan operasinya menerusi premis rumah kedai di Puchong pada tahun 2010 hingga 2011, seterusnya di Kompleks Hentian Bas Pelabuhan Klang pada tahun 2012 hingga 2017 dan kini beroperasi penuh menerusi Kampus MySkills seluas 34 ekar di Kalumpang, Selangor sejak tahun 2018. Penyediaan kemudahan kampus ini adalah bagi memastikan belia dapat menerima latihan dalam persekitaran yang kondusif dan berasaskan keusahawanan.

Menyedari peningkatan cabaran yang dihadapi oleh belia berisiko dan kesan pandemik seperti kekurangan kemahiran masih memberi impak, MySkills Foundation memutuskan untuk melipatgandakan usaha untuk mencapai lebih ramai belia berisiko. Sehingga kini, MySkills telah melahirkan alumni lebih daripada 2,700 belia sepanjang 14 tahun yang lepas. Kini Kampus MySkills dapat menampung kapasiti untuk melatih 400 belia pada sesuatu masa. Empowering At-Risk Youths Through Holistic TVET :

A PARTNERSHIP FOR NATIONAL TVET AGENDA



The visit on 8th January 2025 by the Secretariat of Majlis TVET Negara to MySkills Foundation's Youth Transformation and Entrepreneurship Campus in Kalumpang, Selangor, marks a significant step forward in Malaysia's efforts to create inclusive, impactful, and unified Technical and Vocational Education and Training (TVET) pathways.

Under the leadership of YAB Dato' Seri Dr. Hj Ahmad Zahid Hamidi, Deputy Prime Minister of Malaysia, DASAR TVET NEGARA 2030 aspires to unify the nation's TVET goals and learning pathways, ensuring no youth is left behind in our collective journey toward sustainable development. This vision is deeply aligned with MySkills Foundation's mission to transform the lives of at-risk youths through holistic skills training interventions.

The Secretariat, led by En Muhammad Nizam and his team, visited MySkills to gain insights into its innovative transformation programs. The session delved into critical discussions around:

- The dropout scenario before and after the pandemic: Understanding how socio-economic challenges exacerbated vulnerabilities among at-risk youths and pushed them out of mainstream education.

- MySkills' Second Chance Program model: A proven approach that equips vulnerable youths with life skills, technical training, and character re-engineering, transforming them into responsible, competent human capital.

- 15 years of impact milestones: Highlighting MySkills' journey, including its World Bank-recognised holistic transformation model, recommended for national scaling by the Malaysian Government in 2015.

Malaysia's youth, especially those from vulnerable communities, face challenges that often prevent them from realizing their true potential in traditional academic pathways. Without targeted interventions, these young individuals are at risk of falling through the cracks, contributing to a cycle of poverty and underemployment.

MySkills Foundation's Youth Transformation and Entrepreneurship Campus serves as a sanctuary for these youths, offering a structured environment that fosters growth, learning, and long-term self-

sufficiency. By providing technical, vocational, and entrepreneurial training tailored to the needs of at-risk youths, MySkills is addressing a critical gap in Malaysia's TVET ecosystem.

The visit by Majlis TVET Negara's Secretariat is significant, as it underscores the importance of complementing the national TVET agenda with inclusive programs that cater specifically to at-risk youth. Collaborating with MySkills Foundation not only aligns with the DASAR TVET NEGARA 2030 vision but also ensures the integration of effective, scalable solutions into Malaysia's broader TVET strategy.

Strategic Collaboration To Pioneer

MALAYSIA'S FIRST TVET IN SPORTS (TVET SUKAN)



A transformative partnership led by KOBENA, MySkills Foundation, Zoysian, Michi Global, Majlis Belia OKU and Yayasan Raja Muda Selangor to empower youth through sports-based and inclusive vocational training.

In line with MySkills Foundation's commitment to innovative, industry-relevant pathways for underserved youth, 2025 marked a landmark move as we embarked on an ambitious collaboration with KOBENA and Zoysian (M) Sdn Bhd to lay the groundwork for Malaysia's first Technical and Vocational Education and Training (TVET) syllabus focused on sports – TVET SUKAN.

This pioneering initiative envisions integrating structured vocational modules within the sports sector – enabling young Malaysians, particularly those from B40 and vulnerable backgrounds, to pursue professional careers in coaching, sports management, physiotherapy support, event operations, media, and entrepreneurial roles tied to the sports economy.

The genesis of this collaboration began with a strategic visit by KOBENA's Chief Executive Officer, En Shahrizal Bin Sabarudin, and his leadership team to the MySkills Campus on 24 April 2025. The purpose of the visit was to understand MySkills' transformation model and explore synergies for future collaboration.

Serendipitously, the visit coincided with a Badminton Clinic conducted by ex-national shuttler Coach Roslin Hashim, held at MySkills' sports hall. The event was officiated by YB Puan Hannah Yeoh, Minister of Youth and Sports, whose presence and encouragement greatly amplified the significance of the day.

Following the campus engagement, a pivotal follow-up meeting was held on 7 May 2025 at KOBENA's Headquarters, where all parties agreed in principle to establish a Steering Committee to guide the development and institutionalisation of the TVET Sukan curriculum.

The collaboration will focus on key areas such as technical skills for athletes, sports event logistics, coaching certifications, sports media, green sports technology, and inclusive entrepreneurship. This strategic alignment aims to create a

practical, industry-driven training framework that reflects the evolving landscape of the sports sector and its critical role in community development, youth employability, and national progress.

We extend our deepest gratitude to YB Puan Hannah Yeoh, Minister of Youth and Sports, for her unwavering leadership and vision in championing holistic youth development through sports; her presence at the MySkills campus served as both an inspiration to our students and a catalyst for the inception of TVET Sukan. We also sincerely thank KOBENA, especially En Shahrizal Bin Sabarudin and his team, for their visionary partnership and strong belief in the transformative power of integrating vocational training with the discipline and values of sports, which has been instrumental in shaping the strategic direction of this initiative.





The partnership between MySkills Foundation and Yayasan Hasanah continues to be a cornerstone in our mission to uplift underserved youth from B40/B20 communities. Anchored in a shared vision for sustainable human capital development, this collaboration has enabled MySkills to deliver transformative interventions that combine education, vocational training, and personal development. Over the past year, this strategic partnership has not only deepened our programmatic impact but also expanded our capacity to build meaningful change in the lives of at-risk youth across Malaysia.

Holistic Transformation Skills Training (HTST) - Empowering Livelihoods Through Skills and Mentorship

Since 2022, the Holistic Transformation Skills Training (HTST) program has equipped 100 at-risk youth with vocational skills, leading to internships and job placements across various industries. By 2025, most graduates had completed or were nearing the end of a one-year post-placement support phase, which includes regular check-ins, mentorship, and career guidance. Over 80% of employed graduates retained their jobs for at least a year, reporting increased confidence, stronger communication skills, and stable monthly earnings. These results highlight the program's holistic approach in fostering both employability and long-term resilience.

Beyond the Bells - Elevating Student Potential Beyond the Classroom

Now in its second year, the Beyond the Bells project continues to address learning gaps and school dropout risks among lower secondary students, particularly those transitioning from vernacular primary schools. In 2025, the program scaled up to support 150 students through enrichment sessions covering language mastery, emotional resilience, and leadership skills.

A key highlight was the significant improvement in student's confidence, classroom participation, and social adaptability, as shown in pre- and post-camp assessments. Teachers also observed better peer interactions and increased motivation to learn, reflecting the program's positive influence on overall school culture.





Honouring a Transformative Collaboration :

On October 17, 2024, we were proud to celebrate a meaningful milestone in our shared mission to uplift vulnerable youth, particularly care leavers through the power of skills, opportunity, and human dignity. During the Starlight event, the accompanying video showcase the vibrant, transformative journey of MySkills students, from character reengineering and holistic skills training to successful integration into sustainable employment. These stories stand as testaments to what becomes possible when visionary partners come together to uplift lives.

Since 2013, Basis Bay has contributed in financial and strategic support toward the Foundation's mission of transforming the lives of at-risk youth through vocational training, character development, and values-based education.

Two key initiatives in 2025 marked the ongoing collaboration between MySkills and Basis Bay:

1. "Empower & Grow" Youth Engagement Day

On 21 March 2025, Basis Bay conducted a full-day engagement program at the MySkills Campus in Kalumpang under the theme "Empower and Grow: Empowering Youth through ESG Engagement and Mentorship." The event brought together Basis Bay staff and MySkills students in interactive, skill-sharing activities including moringa tree planting with agriculture students.

The program also featured a career engagement session, where Basis Bay professionals delivered

presentations and provided mentoring to students from the Electrical vocational stream. The day concluded with a team-building telematch focused on strengthening communication, discipline, and confidence among youth participants.

2. Pioneering the Future of Tech Talent MySkills Foundation and Basis Bay for the Data Centre Foundation Certificate

On 5–19 May 2025, ten students from MySkills were selected to participate in the inaugural Data Centre Foundation Certificate (DCFC) Programme, a joint initiative between Basis Bay and Universiti Malaya. The official MoU signing ceremony, held at Sheraton Petaling Jaya, formally appointed MySkills as a partner

for youth talent development in the digital infrastructure sector. The DCFC Programme offers technical training in data centre operations and aims to prepare underserved youth for employment in one of Malaysia's fastest-growing industries. This initiative reflects Basis Bay's commitment to bridging the employability gap while supporting the National Energy Transition Roadmap (NETR) and the Digital Economy Blueprint.

The collaboration between MySkills Foundation and Basis Bay demonstrates how purpose-driven corporate partnerships can deliver scalable impact. By aligning ESG principles with community needs, Basis Bay continues to play a vital role in enabling youth to transition into sustainable careers and contribute meaningfully to the nation's digital future.



EMPOWERING YOUTH TO REBUILD HOMES AND COMMUNITIES WITH IMPACT MALAYSIA



In collaboration with Impact Malaysia and funded by the Ministry of Youth and Sports (KBS) through Akademi Rakan Muda, MySkills Foundation implemented the Better Living Project—an initiative aimed at improving the living conditions of disadvantaged families while equipping youth with hands-on skills in house maintenance.

With a project grant of RM30,000, the initiative set out to train 100 youth volunteers and repair 50 homes in marginalized kampung communities. Over a two-month period, MySkills successfully mobilized 98 youth, who completed basic repair work on 46 houses across three kampungs.

Notably, the town hall in Kg. Tun Abdul Razak also received a full plaster ceiling upgrade, serving as a functional space for the broader community.

The impact was substantial :

- 142 individuals directly benefited from safer, more functional living environments and vocational training.

- An estimated 1,000 indirect beneficiaries—including family members and local residents—gained from the improved housing conditions and community engagement.



This project exemplifies how targeted funding, youth empowerment, and community action can come together to create lasting social value. MySkills remains committed to building skills that strengthen lives—both inside and beyond the classroom.



SUSTAINING SKILL DEVELOPMENT THROUGH MCEF'S LONG-TERM SUPPORT

MySkills Foundation's long-standing collaboration with the Malaysian Community & Education Foundation (MCEF) continues to serve as a powerful force for inclusive education and economic empowerment. Since 2020, MCEF has consistently sponsored financially disadvantaged youths each year, ensuring access to quality vocational training in Electrical (SKM Level 2) alongside practical, hands-on learning.

In the current cycle, 19 students funded under MCEF's 2025 grant have progressed steadily, demonstrating strong competencies in electrical wiring, maintenance, and essential entrepreneurial skills. Their ability to apply these skills in real-world settings, including servicing air-conditioning systems at MCEF's own premises, reflects the practical value and effectiveness of the training.

This continued trust is a testament to the shared vision we uphold—to equip underserved youth with employable skills, financial independence, and a pathway to dignified livelihoods. Together, we are not just funding education, we are creating capable, confident young individuals ready to serve, lead, and contribute meaningfully to society.



The Total Empowerment Camp (TEC) is a 21-day residential program that helps Year 6 - leavers from vernacular schools transition into national secondary schools by addressing language barriers, academic gaps, and socio-economic challenges. In 2025, TEC reached 248 high-risk students across Selangor, Johor, and Kedah, focusing on language immersion, socio-emotional development, and vocational exposure. The program is supported by Yayasan Hasanah and EWRF, who will continue to provide post-camp mentoring and academic support.

Beyond The Bells Initiative at SJKT Bukit Serampang, Johor

Conducted in partnership with Yayasan Hasanah, this school-based camp reached 150 students and emphasized academic recovery, language development, and self-confidence. Local educators and community leaders played key roles in delivering impactful and inclusive programming.



TEC @ MySkills Campus, Selangor
65 students participated in a residential program focused on language immersion, structured routines, and group coaching. Students gained confidence and life skills, with added exposure to vocational training in a supportive campus environment.

In collaboration with Hong Leong Bank, we are launching a Jumpstart Program aimed at creating a lasting impact by advancing financial inclusion, promoting nutritional well-being, and empowering individuals through entrepreneurship and education.

MySkills Endowment Fund -

Towards Self Sustenance

BACKGROUND OF MYSKILLS FOUNDATION

- A. MySkills was formally registered on 3.3.2011. Primary objective of MySkills is to provide a SECOND opportunity (to many it is ONLY opportunity) to transform and acquire a skill. With the acquired skills, they are free to lead a decent and crime free life. MySkills works with only dropout and at-risk students from the tender age of 13 to 17 years old.
- B. Every year approximately 150 students graduate from MySkills with a government recognised skills training certificate and gainfully employed.

CURRENT FINANCIAL STATUS

1. As of December 2024, all students are provided with transformation and skills training together with meal and accommodation at no cost.
2. It cost RM 15,000 to maintain a student for a year at MySkills. This includes cost of transformation, skills training, accommodation, trainees' salary, Campus upkeep and maintenance.



3. On an average, we require RM 3 Million a year to meet the Operational and Capital Expenditures. From January 2011 to December 2024 (14 years), we have spent **RM 46 million** to meet the Operational Expenditure and **RM 21 Million** for the Capital Expenditure (Please refer to the table below):

4. Assuming in 2011, we had an Endowment Fund of RM 30 million, the income from the Endowment Fund would have taken care of the Operational expenses while maintaining the capital of the Endowment Fund of RM 30 Million.
5. In short, our ultimate aim is the income from the Endowment Fund will take of MySkills Foundation Operational expenses **perpetually**.

WHAT IS AN ENDOWMENT FUND

Endowment operates like an EPF, a Pension Fund of a person after his retirement from a non-governmental organization (NGO). Endowment Fund is a financial asset, typically held by the NGO that is invested to generate income over the long term. The principal amount of the Endowment Fund is usually kept intact, while the income generated from the investments is used for Operational expenses, progress or any other permitted initiations of the organisation.

Key Features of an Endowment Fund :

1. **Permanent Capital :**
The principal amount is preserved to ensure the fund can generate income indefinitely.
2. **Investment Income:**
The fund generates income through various investments, such as stocks, bonds, or real estate.
3. **Spending Policy :**
Organizations often have a specific policy that defines how much of the generated income can be spent each year.

IMPORTANCE OF ENDOWMENT FUND FOR FINANCIAL SUSTAINABILITY OF NGO'S

1. **Steady Revenue Stream :**
Endowment funds provide a consistent and predictable source of income, which can help NGOs manage their finances more effectively and plan for the long term.
2. **Financial Stability :**
With endowment funds, NGOs can reduce their reliance on fluctuating donation levels and grants, making them less vulnerable to economic downturns or changes in funding landscapes.
3. **Capacity for Long-term Planning :**
The steady income enables NGOs to engage in strategic planning, allowing them to invest in larger projects or initiatives without the constant pressure of fundraising.

PLANS TO RAISE THE CAPITAL FUND FOR THE ENDOWMENT FUND.

As of 1st December 2024, our Endowment Fund status is at RM 3.5 Million.

We need to raise RM 16.5 Million to achieve our target by 2027.

4. Increased Credibility :

A well-managed endowment fund can enhance an NGO's reputation and credibility with donors, showing that the organization is committed to long-term sustainability and responsible financial management.

5. Support for Mission :

Endowment funds can help ensure that an organization's mission continues to be funded over time, ensuring that valuable programs and services can persist and grow.

FUTURE SUSTAINABILITY OF MYSKILLS FOUNDATION

- A. From Students – MySkills spends on the average RM 45,000 to maintain a student at MySkills for the period of 3 years. At the end of the course, MySkills wants the student to be financially responsible by paying maximum RM 10,000 to MySkills for future financial sustenance.

From this stream, MySkills may be able to raise **RM 800,000 to RM 1,000,000** per year.

- B. We have regular monthly donors who contribute **RM 40,000** a month (ranging from RM 50 to RM 1,000).

- C. Assuming MySkills managed to create an **Endowment Fund of RM 20 Million**. Based on 8% return, MySkills may be able to raise **RM 1,600,000**.
